GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS

You are invited to submit your sealed bid to provide Soft Goods for the 6th Avenue Wing at Sunny Hill Nursing Home, Joliet, IL. Complete bid specifications are attached.

SEALED BIDS:

Bids will be received in the Purchasing Department, 2nd floor, Will County Office Building, 302 N. Chicago St., Joliet, IL 60432, **not later than 11:00 A.M., Wednesday, August 17, 2016, "as so indicated by the time stamp clock of Will County"**. **BIDS RECEIVED AFTER THIS TIME WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**

Sealed bids will be publicly opened and read aloud by the Will County Executive or his representative at **11:10 A.M., Wednesday, August 17, 2016** at the Will County Office Building, 302 N. Chicago St., 2nd FLR. Executive Conference Room, Joliet, IL. 60432.

A 10% Bid Bond or Cashier's check made payable to the Will County Treasurer must accompany your Bid, or it will not be considered. Money Orders or Company checks will not be accepted.

Bids must be made in accordance with the instructions contained herein.

Bid forms shall be completely filled out either typewritten or in ink and shall not be detached from this package. The **complete set of Contract Documents shall be submitted** with the proposal, in triplicate with **ONE ORIGINAL AND TWO COPIES, CLEARLY MARKED.** All Bid Forms and Specifications as attached hereto shall be used to form the Contract for the work to be performed.

Proposals shall be submitted on the forms furnished by the County of Will in a sealed package, **plainly marked**, with the bidder's name, address, and the notation:

If the package is not properly marked it could delay delivery or cause the package to be delivered to the incorrect party, therefore, causing the bid to miss the bid opening. The bid will be rejected.

Bids shall be addressed to the Will County Purchasing Department, Will County Office Building, 302 N. Chicago St., Joliet, IL 60432.

SIGNATURE OF BIDS:

The **signature on bid documents** shall be that of an authorized representative of bidder. An officer of or agent of the offering bidder who is empowered to bind the bidder in a Contract shall sign the proposal and any clarifications to that proposal.

Each bidder, by making his bid, represents that bidder has read and understands the bidding documents. **Any bid not containing said signed documents shall be non-conforming and shall be rejected.**

BIDDING PROCEDURES:

1. All bids must be prepared on the forms provided by the County and submitted in triplicate, with **ONE ORIGINAL AND TWO COPIES, CLEARLY MARKED**, in accordance with the instructions to bidders.
2. A bid is invalid if it has not been deposited at the designated location prior to the time and date for receipt of bids indicated in the Advertisement for Bids or prior to any extension thereof issued to the bidders.
3. Unless otherwise provided in any supplement to the instructions to bidders, no bidder shall modify, withdraw or cancel its bid or any part thereof for ninety (90) days after the time designated for the receipt of bids in the Advertisement for Bids.
4. Changes or corrections may be made in the bid documents after they have been issued and before bids are received. In such cases a written addendum describing the change or correction will be issued by the County of Will to all bidders recorded by the County of Will as having received the bidding documents and will be available for inspection wherever issued. Such addendum shall take precedence over that portion of the documents concerned and any conflicting provisions, and shall become part of the bid documents. Unless impracticable, such an addendum will be issued to reach the bidders at least five (5) days prior to date established for receipt of bids.

Each bidder shall carefully examine all bid documents and all addenda thereto, and shall thoroughly familiarize itself with the detailed requirements thereof prior to submitting a proposal. Should a bidder find discrepancies or ambiguities in, or omissions from documents, or should a bidder be in doubt as to their meaning, it shall, at once, and in any event, not later than seven (7) days prior to bid due date, notify the County of Will, who will, if necessary, send a written addendum to all bidders.

The County of Will specifically disclaims, and shall not be responsible for, any oral instructions. All inquiries shall be directed to Rita Weiss, in writing at rweiss@willcountyillinois.com. After bids are received, no allowance will be made for oversight by the Bidder.

REJECTION OF BIDS:

The bidder acknowledges the right of the County of Will to reject any or all bids, to waive any non-material informality or irregularity in any bid received, and to accept the bid deemed most favorable to the interest of the County of Will after all bids have been examined and evaluated. In addition, the bidder recognizes the right of the County of Will to reject a bid if the bid is in any way incomplete or irregular.

BID SECURITY:

A 10% Bid Bond or Cashiers Check made payable to the Will County Treasurer shall accompany each bid, attached to the front cover, as a guarantee that if the bid is accepted, a Contract will be entered into. **Money Orders or Company checks will not be accepted.** The unsuccessful bidders' checks will be returned after the County Board has awarded the bid.

NO BIDS:

Those who wish not to bid this project please return your bid plainly marked "**NO BID**" or send email indicating "**NO BID**" to retain your company's name on our bidders list. If you choose not to reply your company name will be removed and no future bids will be automatically sent to you.

PRIME CONTRACTOR CERTIFICATION:

Included in this bid package is a prime contractor certification form. This form **must** be filled out and returned with your bid package or it will not be accepted.

ADVERTISEMENTS:

The bidder shall not place or maintain any signs, bills, posters, or other advertisements in or about the building, except by written permission of County.

SUBSTITUTIONS:

1. Each bidder represents that its bid is based upon the materials and equipment described in the bidding documents.
2. Each bidder shall enclose literature with its bid for a more accurate evaluation of the bid and these specifications.
3. Where brand names are mentioned in the specifications, use only as a reference to the type and quality of materials or equipment desired. All vendors bidding on alternate/ equal product must fill in model number, and supply specifications of product. There is a space on each line below the item to insert your product description, brand name and any other information you feel will help us in evaluating your bid.
4. Bids will be considered on equipment or material complying substantially with specifications provided, each deviation is stated and the substitution is described, including technical data when applicable, in a letter attached to the bid. **The Sunny Hill Nursing Home Administrator reserves the right to determine whether such substitutions or deviations are within the intent of the specifications and will reasonably meet the requirements of the department.**

PRODUCT SAMPLES:

You may be required to submit samples of your products for better evaluation.

WORDS AND FIGURES:

Where amounts are given in both words and figures, the words shall govern. If the amount is not written in words the unit cost will take precedence over the extended price in case of a discrepancy in the multiplication.

TAX EXEMPTION:

The County of Will is exempt from Federal, State and Municipal Taxes.

NON-DISCRIMINATION:

The bidder shall at all times observe and comply with any law, statute, regulation or the like relating in any way to civil rights including but not limited to the Public Works Employment Discrimination Act, 775 ILCS 10/0.01 et seq.

DEFAULT:

In case of default by the successful Bidder, the County of Will may procure the articles or services from other sources and may deduct from the unpaid balance due the successful bidder any of its costs resulting from the default, or may collect against the bond or surety for excess costs so paid, and the prices paid by the County of Will shall be considered the prevailing market price at the time such purchase is made.

ILLINOIS FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT:

Any and all submissions to the County of Will become the property of the County of Will and these and any late submissions will not be returned. Your proposal will be open to the public under the Illinois Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) (5 ILCS 140) and other applicable laws and rules, unless you request in your proposal that we treat certain information as exempt. We will not honor requests to exempt entire proposals. You must show the specific grounds in FOIA or other law or rule that support exempt treatment. If you request exempt treatment, you must submit an additional copy of the proposal with exempt information deleted. This copy must tell the general nature of the material removed and shall retain as much of the proposal as possible. In the event the County of Will receives a request for a document submitted, the County of Will shall provide notice to contractor as soon as practicable. Regardless, contractor will be responsible for any costs or damages associated with defending your request for exempt treatment. Furthermore, contractor warrants that County of Will's responses to requests for a document submitted that is not requested to be exempt will not violate the rights of any third party.

Please be advised that if your proposal is accepted by the County of Will all related records maintained by, provided to, or required to be provided to the County of Will during the contract duration are subject to FOIA. In the event the County of Will receives a request for a document relating to contractor, its provision of services, or the arranging for the provision of services, the County of Will shall provide notice to contractor as soon as practicable and, within the period available under FOIA, contractor may then identify those records, or portions thereof, that it in good faith believes to be exempt from production and the justification for such exemption. Regardless, contractor will be responsible for any costs or damages associated with defending the request for exempt treatment. Furthermore, contractor will warrant that County of Will's responses to requests for a document relating to contractor, its provision of services, or the arranging for the provision of services, or the arranging for the provision of services, will not violate the rights of any third party.

Please be advised also that FOIA provides that any record in the possession of a party with whom the County of Will has contracted to perform a governmental function on behalf of the County of Will, and that directly relates to the governmental function and is not otherwise exempt under FOIA is considered a public record of the County of Will for purposes of FOIA. 5 ILCS 140/7(2). As such, upon request by the County of Will (or any of its officers, agents, employees or officials), the contractor shall provide to the County of Will at no cost and within the timeframes of FOIA a copy of any "public record" as required by FOIA and in compliance with the provisions of FOIA. AWARDING OF BID:

The bidder acknowledges the right of the County of Will to reject any bids in whole or in part not in compliance with the request for bids and the right to waive any non-material informalities or irregularities for any bid received and to accept the lowest responsible, responsive bid after all bids have been examined and evaluated. The bid is expected to be awarded at the September 15, 2016 meeting of the Will County Board, after which a letter of intent will be sent notifying the successful vendor of the award.

Note: A person who makes a false certificate commits a Class 3 Felony.

Sections 33E-3 and 33E-4 provide as follows:

33E-3. Bid-rigging. A person commits the offense of bid-rigging when he knowingly agrees with any person who is, or but for such agreement would be, a competitor of such person concerning any bid submitted or not submitted by such person or another to a unit of State or local government when with the intent that the bid submitted or not submitted will result in the award of a contract to such person or another and he either (1) provides such person or receives from another information concerning the price or other material term or terms of the bid which would otherwise not be disclosed to a competitor in an independent noncollusive submission of bids or (2) submits a bid that is of such a price or other material term or terms that he does not intend the bid to be accepted.

Bid rigging is a Class 3 felony. Any person convicted of this offense or any similar offense of any state or the United States which contains the same elements as this offense shall be barred for 5 years from the date of conviction from contracting with any unit of State or local government. No corporation shall be barred from contracting with any unit of State or local government as a result of a conviction under this Section of any employee or agent of such corporation if the employee so convicted is no longer employed by the corporation and: (1) it has been finally adjudicated not guilty or (2) if it demonstrates to the governmental entity with which it seeks to contract and that entity finds that the commission of the offense was neither authorized, requested, commanded, nor performed by a director, officer or a high managerial agent in behalf of the corporation as provided in paragraph (2) of subsection (a) of Section 5-4 of this Code.

33E-4 Bid rotating. A person commits the offense of bid rotating when, pursuant to any collusive scheme or agreement with another, he engages in a pattern over time (which, for the purposes of this Section, shall include at least 3 contract bids within a period of 10 years, the most recent of which occurs after the effective date of this amendatory Act of 1988) of submitting sealed bids to units of State or local government with the intent that the award of such bids rotates, or is distributed among, persons or business entities which submit bids on a substantial number of the same contracts. Bid rotating is a Class 2 felony. Any person convicted of this offense or any similar offense of any state or the United States which contains the same elements as this offense shall be permanently barred from contracting with any unit of State or local government. No corporation shall be barred from contracting with any unit of State or local government as a result of a conviction under this Section of any employee or agent of such corporation if the employee so convicted is no longer employed by the corporation and: (1) it has been finally adjudicated not guilty or (2) if it demonstrates to the governmental entity with which it seeks to contract and that entity finds that the commission of the offense was neither authorized, requested, commanded, nor performed by a director, officer or a high managerial agent in behalf of the corporation as provided in paragraph (2) of subsection (a) of Section 5-4 of this Code.






